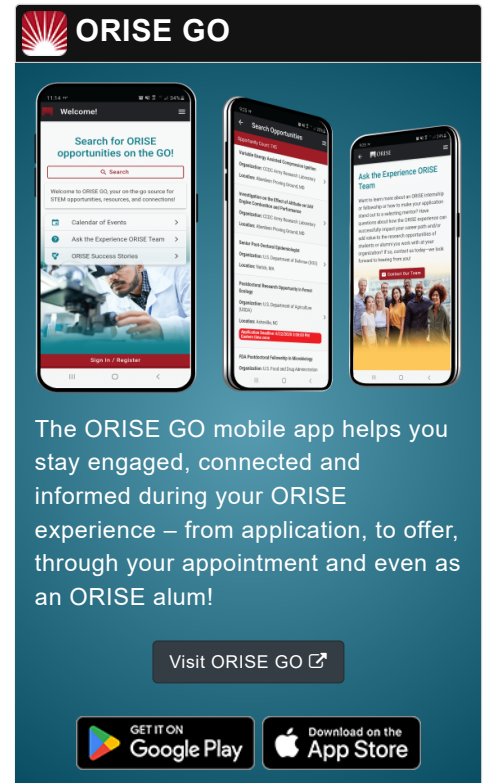
Research Project: Hosted by NCBDDD, and under the guidance of a mentor, the participant will receive training on:

- Contributing to the development of internal and external reports and other administrative level documents
- Monitoring program performance through various internal and external performance reporting channels

Learning Objectives: The participant may also train in cross-cutting policy activities, such as partnership development, community relations, and program management to enable the participant to develop skills in the breadth of policy functions at CDC that will well position the participant for a variety of potential future opportunities.
