<u>CDC Office and Location</u>: A research opportunity is currently available with the National Center for HIV/AIDS, Viral Hepatitis, STD, and TB Prevention (NCHHSTP) at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in Atlanta, Georgia.


Research Project: The selected participant will receive training from NCHHSTP Office of Health Equity mentors in developing and implementing research projects that inform the development of effective strategies and interventions to reduce disparities in HIV, other STDs, TB and viral hepatitis and improve school health among one or more disproportionately affected populations. Effective strategies will support the guiding principal of high impact prevention, a public health approach to disease prevention in which proven, cost-effective and scalable interventions are implemented for preventing the greatest amount of infections or for reducing disparities, given available resources. Mentors and participants will collaborate to develop a list of diverse research activities that they will complete together over the two year (subject to funding) training period. These activities will be based on the participant's area(s) of interest, training, and experience and the mission of the NCHHSTP Office of Health Equity.

<u>Learning Objectives</u>: The activities listed below represent the minimum training opportunities that the participant will complete.

- Conduct or participate in one site visit related to a health-equity related research project or
 programmatic activity subject to the availability of funding and travel restrictions due to the
 SARS-CoV-2 pandemic.
- Design, conduct, and interpret an analysis on public health data.
- Write and submit at least two scientific manuscripts for a peer-reviewed journal.
- · Present an oral presentation or poster at one scientific meeting.
- Attend monthly scientific meetings on emerging health equity issues.

Appointment Length: The appointment will initially be for one year, but may be renewed upon recommendation of CDC and is contingent on the availability of funds.

Level of Participation: The appointment is full-time.

Participant Stipend: The participant will receive a monthly stipend commensurate with educational level and experience.

Citizenship Requirements: This opportunity is available to U.S. citizens, Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR), and foreign nationals.
