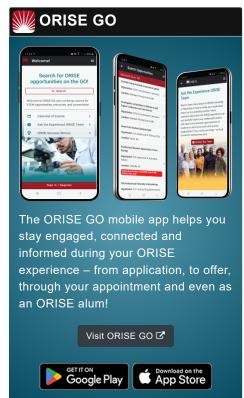

ARS will deliver cutting-edge, scientific tools and innovative solutions for American farmers, producers, industry, and communities to support the nourishment and well-being of all people; sustain our nation's agroecosystems and natural resources; and ensure the economic competitiveness and excellence of our agriculture. The vision the agency is to provide global leadership in agricultural discoveries through scientific excellence.

Research Project: Environmental and agricultural research to develop value added products from waste biomass, including bio-fertilizer and other soil amendments. Participant will engage, under mentorship, in environmental and agricultural research to develop value-added products from waste biomass and other agricultural byproducts. Target finished products will include biofertilizer, bio-stimulant, and other soil amendments. Participant will gain laboratory skills to develop and characterize materials for microbial composition and physicochemical properties.

<u>Learning Objectives</u>: Participant will gain experimental skills including fluorescence spectrophotometry, electrochemistry, liquid chromatography, and simulated photochemical reactors to evaluate developed materials and to predict their environmental fate.
