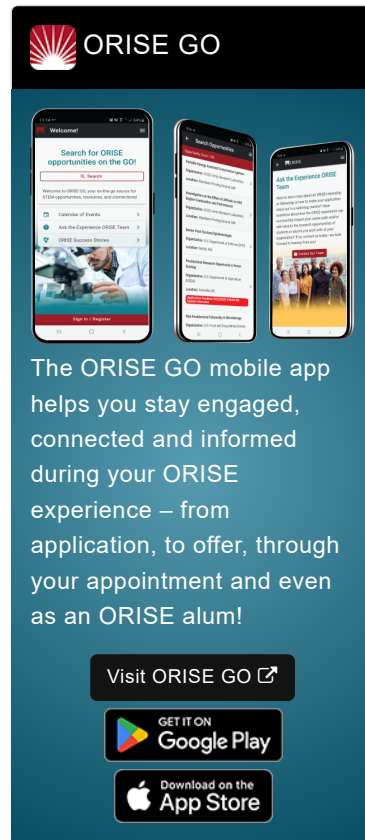

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is one of the major operation components of the Department of Health and Human Services. CDC works to protect America from health, safety and security threats, both foreign and in the U.S. Whether diseases start at home or abroad, are chronic or acute, curable or preventable, human error or deliberate attack, CDC fights disease and supports communities and citizens to do the same.

Research Project: The participant will assist with the development of research agendas, writing protocols, data analyses, and publication of results as well as support for public health programs to support emergency response activities in sexual and reproductive health and nutrition. The participant may have the opportunity to travel internationally and work in countries affected by humanitarian crises. The participant will conduct research under the general direction of CDC's Emergency Response and Recovery - Humanitarian Health Team.


Learning Objectives: Throughout the course of this research project, the participant will develop and enhance their epidemiological and statistical analysis skills while supporting operational research, outcome evaluations of interventions and programs, and analysis of large datasets in both the fields of sexual and reproductive health as well as emergency nutrition.
