HHS Office and Location: There is a fellowship opportunity at the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health (OASH), Office of Policy and Legislation (OPL), at the United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) in Washington, D.C. Candidate must be located in Washington, D.C. to come into the office a few times a week.

The mission of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is to enhance the health and well-being of all Americans, by providing for effective health and human services and by fostering sound, sustained advances in the sciences underlying medicine, public health, and social services.

<u>Research Project</u>: The Office of the Assistant Secretary of Health (OASH) is seeking an ORISE Fellow to support the Office of Policy and Legislation (OPL).

The OPL advises the Assistant Secretary for Health (ASH) on health, public health, and science policy and legislation. The OPL establishes crosscutting strategies to advance OASH's mission, programs, initiatives, activities, and other priorities. The OPL is also responsible for review, analysis, and recommendations on health legislation, regulations, and policy; budget analyses; program evaluation; and correspondence or document management and clearance. The OPL coordinates with other federal agencies and private sector organizations.

<u>Appointment Length</u>: The appointment will initially be for one year, but may be renewed upon recommendation of HHS and is contingent on the availability of funds.

Level of Participation: The appointment is 20-40 hours to be negotiated during selection.

<u>Participant Stipend</u>: The participant will receive a monthly stipend commensurate with educational level and experience.

Citizenship Requirements: This opportunity is available to U.S. citizens, Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR), and foreign nationals.
