SRS is "dedicated to; environmental cleanup, nuclear weapons stockpile stewardship, and nuclear materials disposition, in support of the U.S. nuclear non-proliferation efforts. The site also develops and deploys technologies to support radiological and chemical cleanup activities following approximately 50 years of producing materials used for nuclear weapons, primarily plutonium and tritium."

The Scholar will receive training, mentoring, and additional support to effectively accomplish appointment goals.

Appointments may involve projects focused on engineering, science, research, technology, policy, business, and government relations.

Travel


Travel reimbursement of inbound and outbound costs up to \$1,000 for participants who live more than fifty miles, one-way, from the assigned hosting site.
