

The TWH Program contributes to NIOSH's mission to develop new knowledge in the field of occupational safety and health by promoting and fostering research to increase understanding of health conditions that may not arise from work but that can be adversely affected by work.

Selected participant will be introduced to NIOSH TWH research projects at different stages of the knowledge generation continuum, including project conception, partnership development, manuscript writing and review.

Participant will interact with the NIOSH Total Worker Health Program Coordinator for Research Development and Collaboration and other staff and assist in the review, preparation, and organization of research project files including manuscripts, literature reviews, data collection and analysis, and assuring project timelines are on course for completion.
- After learning about the NIOSH Total Worker Health
 Program, and in consultation with the mentor and other
 staff, the participant can propose a related project of interest
 to them.
