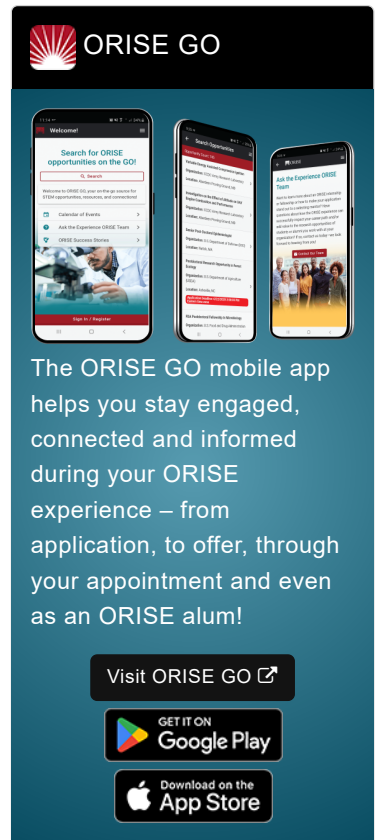

The fellow may be involved in the following activities:

- Helping to engage CDC subject matter experts around evidence-based interventions and practices for preventive services at the clinical, community, and population levels
- Identifying, through the use of evaluation techniques, community partnership best practices around continuous improvement processes and innovative practices resulting from community health needs assessment requirements
- Participate with internal partners to support the evaluation of the 6/18 initiative which is designed to increase utilization of existing clinical preventive services and innovative preventive services that extend into the community
- Support internal partners to develop an evaluation approach for community-wide prevention approaches; support the execution of this evaluation plan

- Identify ways that CDC can support the evaluation of accountable communities of health that link health systems with programs that address the social determinants of health
- Devising an overall evaluation approach for OADP's Policy Action Plan, a five-component plan to advance policy-related efforts throughout CDC
- Creating a logic model for the Policy Process, then collecting and analyzing the evaluation data for applications of the Policy Process and writing up results in an evaluation report
- Developing evaluation plans for policy/economic capacity building initiatives such as the CDC Policy Academy, Policy Community of Practice, Economics Forum, online decision support portal, etc.

This program, administered by ORAU through its contract with the U.S. Department of Energy to manage the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education, was established through an interagency agreement between DOE and CDC. The initial appointment is for one year, but may be renewed upon recommendation of CDC contingent on the availability of funds. The participant will receive a monthly stipend commensurate with educational level and experience. Proof of health insurance is required for participation in this program. The appointment is full-time at CDC in the Atlanta, Georgia, area. Participants do not become employees of CDC or the program administrator, and there are no fringe benefits paid.

Qualifications A master's or doctoral degree in health policy, public health, health services research, behavioral science research, or a related field received within five years of the starting date.

Prior experience conducting program evaluation, policy analysis, public health research, or health services research is preferred.
