Description The Department of Defense (DoD) is offering a post bachelor's internship at The Defense Centers for Public Health - Aberdeen.

What will I be doing?

This opportunity is within the Health Communication Science Division in the Public Health Communication Directorate. As an ORISE participant, you will join a community of scientists and researchers in an effort to participate with all manner of evidence-based public health communication across multiple platforms and channels.

Why should I apply?

Under the guidance of a mentor, you will gain hands-on experience to complement your education and support your academic and professional goals. Along the way, you will engage in activities and research in several areas. These include, but are not limited to:

- Plan, apply, and evaluate various communication science and marketing techniques to achieve optimal program results and promote positive health outcomes.
- Engage in science-based communication initiatives to increase awareness, education, and knowledge throughout the health sciences.
- Gain experience in multidisciplinary public health communication campaign research, analysis, planning, and writing, to include communication product development and distribution.
- Learn about product requirements and specifications and will be able to adjust as necessary based on client feedback and user research.
- Visualize and translate technical information into plain language appropriate to the stakeholders using a variety of methods and tools.
- Develop and use skills and judgment to guide the development, testing, and dissemination of scientific information and audience-based products, tools, and messages (i.e., via written, electronic, and audiovisual formats).
- Develop knowledge of theories, concepts, principles, practices, methods, and techniques of public health communication to accomplish the task.

Where will I be located?



What is the anticipated start date?

The DCPH-A is ready to make appointments immediately. Exact start dates will be determined at the time of selection and in coordination with the selected candidate. Applications are reviewed on an ongoing basis and internships or fellowships will be filled as qualified candidates are identified.

What is the appointment length?

This appointment is a twelve-month research appointment, with the possibility to be renewed for additional research periods. Appointments may be extended depending on funding availability,

What are the appointment provisions?

You will receive a stipend to be determined by DCPH-A. Stipends are typically based on a participant's academic standing, discipline, experience, and research facility location. Other provisions may include the following:

- *Relocation Allowance*
- Training and Travel Allowance

Participants do not enter into an employee/employer relationship with ORISE, ORAU, DoD or any other office or agency. Instead, you will be affiliated with ORISE for the administration of the appointment through the ORISE appointment letter and Terms of Appointment. Proof of health insurance is required for participation in this program. Health insurance can be obtained through ORISE. Qualifications The qualified candidate will have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in health communication, social media, web content management, public health, health marketing, or similar field. Degree must have been received within five years of the appointment start date. U.S. military veterans who have been honorably discharged (or who have been medically discharged because of a service-connected disability) and who received a bachelor's degree within ten years of the desired start date are also eligible.

Highly competitive applicants will have education and/or experience in one or more of the following:

- Experience in collaborating on multi-disciplinary projects
- Experience with internal and external communications
- Experience with information management.
- Experience with HTML coding
