**Description** The Walter Reed Army Institute of Research – West (WRAIR-W) located in Tacoma, Washington is offering research opportunities for current undergraduate and graduate level students studying neurosciences, clinical psychology, public health and other eligible disciplines. The WRAIR-W team is strategically co-located with the Madigan Army Medical Center (MAMC) at Joint Base Lewis-McChord (JBLM). The mission of WRAIR-W is to conduct research and deliver solutions to promote psychological readiness and improve behavioral health outcomes for Service Members.

**Why should I apply?**

As the selected candidate and under the guidance of a mentor, you will learn how research advances solutions to increase resilience, recovery, and readiness to maximize service member health and performance.

**Where will I be located?**

Tacoma, Washington

**What is the anticipated start date?**

October 1, 2025. WRAIR is ready to make appointments immediately. Exact start dates will be determined at the time of selection and in coordination with the selected candidate. Applications are reviewed on an ongoing basis, and internships or fellowships will be filled as qualified candidates are identified.

**What is the appointment length?**

Appointments are initially for one year with the option to extend the appointment for up to four additional years, contingent upon project needs and funding availability.


**What are the provisions?**

**Qualifications** The qualified candidate will hold or is currently pursuing a bachelor's or master's degree in an eligible discipline. Degree must have been received within five years of the appointment start date. U.S. military veterans who have been honorably discharged (or who have been medically discharged because of a service-connected disability) and who received a bachelor's or master's degree within ten years of the desired start date are also eligible.

Highly competitive candidates will also have experience and/or skills in the following:

- Research in domain(s) relevant to psychology, behavioral science, neurobiology, cognitive neuroscience, nursing, psychiatry.
- Data collection, such as neuropsychological assessment, physiological assessment, biospecimen processing, and survey/self-reported response methods
- Excellent oral, email, and written communication skills
