Description The Department of Defense (DoD) is offering undergraduate internships at the DEVCOM Chemical and Biological Center (DEVCOM CBC).

What will I be doing?

As an ORISE participant, you will join a community of scientists and researchers in an effort to gain insight into novel methods used to predict toxicity of various chemicals and gain understanding how chemicals impact the ecosystem.

Why should I apply?

Under the guidance of a mentor, you will gain hands-on experience to complement your education and support your academic and professional goals. During your appointment, you will engage in activities and research in several areas. These include, but are not limited to:

1. Cell culturing and aseptic techniques
2. Implementation Design of Experiments (DOE) statistical methods
3. Maintaining cultures of cells and/or organisms
4. Activity and analytical techniques such as plate assays and HPLC

Throughout your participation, you will have the opportunity to advance your general molecular biology skills, environmental ecology skills, scientific communication, methods development, presentation and communication skills. In addition, you will collaborate with a diverse team of researchers with the common goal of characterizing chemicals and understanding their impact to humans and the environment.

Where will I be located?

Edgewood, Maryland

What is the anticipated start date?

DEVCOM-CBC is ready to make appointments immediately. Exact start dates will be determined at the time of selection and in coordination with the selected candidate. Applications are reviewed on an ongoing basis and internships will be filled as qualified candidates are identified.


What is the appointment length?

An ORISE appointment period can be a short-term (less than 2 weeks), summer (10-12 weeks), or yearlong appointment. Appointments may be extended depending on funding availability, project assignment, program rules, and availability of the participant.

What are the provisions?

You will receive a stipend to be determined by DEVCOM CBC. Stipends are typically based on a participant's academic standing, discipline, experience, and research facility location. Other benefits may include the following:
