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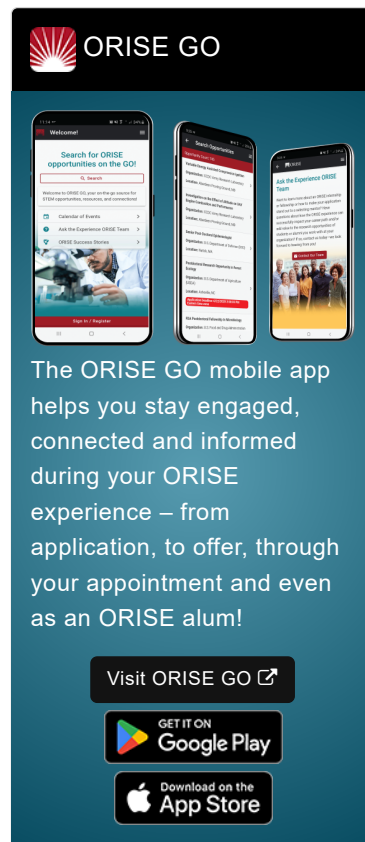

CDC Office and Location: A research opportunity is currently available with the Division of Regulatory Science and Compliance (DRSC), within the Office of Readiness and Response (ORR) at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in Atlanta, Georgia.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is one of the major operation components of the Department of Health and Human Services. CDC protects America from health, safety and security threats, both foreign and in the U.S. Whether diseases start at home or abroad, are chronic or acute, curable or preventable, human error or deliberate attack, CDC fights disease and supports communities and citizens to do the same. CDC increases the health security of our nation. As the nation's health protection agency, CDC saves lives and protects people from health threats. To accomplish its mission, CDC conducts important science and provides health information that protects our nation against expensive and dangerous health threats, and responds when these arise.

Research Project: Research with select agents and toxins provides important scientific discoveries that have led to improved detection and prevention of human, animal and plant diseases, as well as diagnostic and treatment options to address them. Common examples of select agents and toxins include *Bacillus anthracis* (the causative agent of anthrax), variola major virus (the causative agent of smallpox) and botulinum neurotoxins. The Federal Select Agent Program (FSAP) regulates laboratories that conduct research on these potentially dangerous select agents and toxins,



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while ensuring this work is done as safely and securely as possible.

Learning Objectives: Under the guidance of a mentor, you will learn from DRSC's Biosafety, Science, Training, and Expertise Branch while participating in a variety of projects including, but not limited to:

- Understanding how to review requests from regulated laboratories
- Learning how to develop guidance for the regulated community
- Developing skills required to perform literature reviews on biological agents and toxins
- Learning how to collect and analyze program data
- Understanding how to develop training materials for inspectors
- Understanding how to engage with new initiatives and projects to develop programmatic improvements
- Building skills required to develop content for, and engage in outreach to, the regulated community and other partners

You will also learn how to apply subject matter expertise and answer scientific questions that arise. You will gain experience engaging with other microbiologists and subject matter experts at CDC and other federal agencies, and will gain a broader knowledge of scientific regulation, biosafety and biocontainment, and policy development. You may also be participate with the Policy Team to learn about strategic planning, facilitating oversight studies of DRSC, and regulatory and policy matters related to FSAP.

Anticipated Appointment Start Date: 2026. Start date is flexible and will depend on a variety of factors.

Appointment Length: The appointment will initially be for one year, but may be renewed upon recommendation of CDC and is contingent on the availability of funds.

Level of Participation: The appointment is full time.

Participant Stipend: Stipend rates may vary based on numerous factors, including opportunity, location, education, and experience. If you are interviewed, you can inquire about the exact stipend rate at that time and if selected, your appointment offer will include the monthly stipend rate.
