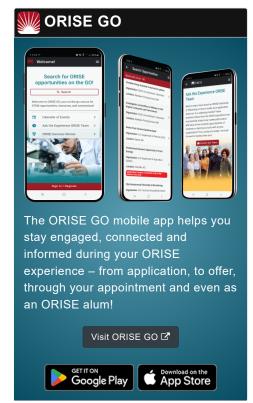

Under the guidance of a mentor, the participant will be involved in the design, development, and evaluation of public health communication products and activities for CDC's Emergency Response and Recovery Branch (ERRB). This training will offer the opportunity to learn about and obtain hands-on experience in the following activities:

- Collaborate with SME's at a high and strategic level and contribute to the design of products that demonstrate CDC's role in humanitarian health, disease outbreak detection, and rapid response
- Synthesize data to write summary reports with actionable recommendations
- Contribute to the development of articles, presentations, and scientific publications
- Review and analyze relevant data and communicate findings to multiple audiences, including senior leadership
- Update case studies and curricula for various trainings conducted by ERRB
- Contribute to the development and tailoring of existing products (e.g., case studies, presentation slides, applied learning activities, handouts, worksheets) for identified audiences

established through an interagency agreement between DOE and CDC. The initial appointment can be up to one year, but may be renewed upon recommendation of CDC contingent on the availability of funds. The participant will receive a monthly stipend commensurate with educational level and experience. Proof of health insurance is required for participation in this program. The appointment is full-time at CDC in the Atlanta, Georgia, area. Participants do not become employees of CDC, DOE or the program administrator, and there are no employment-related benefits.

The qualified candidate should be currently pursuing or have received a master's or doctoral degree in one of the relevant fields. Degree must have been received within five years of the appointment start date.
