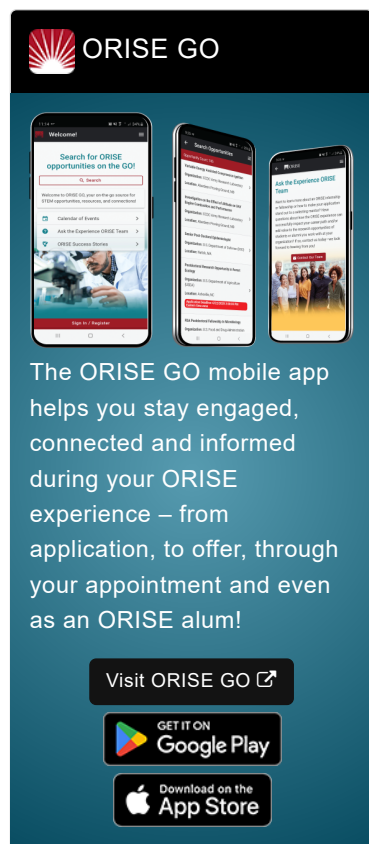
A research opportunity is currently available with the Policy, Planning, Evaluation, and Communication team (PPEC), within the Division of Emergency Operations (DEO) in the Center for Preparedness and Response (CPR) at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in Atlanta, Georgia.

Under the guidance of a mentor, the participant will have the opportunity to be involved in the following activities:

- **Policy:** Learn how to respond to the full spectrum of policy requests regarding DEO's public health emergency preparedness and responses; Learn about CDC's graduated response framework with the opportunity to observe leaders and contribute to activities; observe the development of partnerships with non-governmental and private sector stakeholders.
- **Communication:** Learn how to develop emergency preparedness communications products and activities, which may include the division's website, fact sheets, success stories, newsletters, campaigns, presentations, and articles; learn how to assist with the clearance of documents/publications. The participant will also have the opportunity to contribute to data visualization tool development/reviews, etc.
- **Response:** Learn about CDC's Centers, Institute, and Offices, with the opportunity to engage in preparedness and response efforts linked to COVID-19 and other public health emergencies/events.


Anticipated Appointment Start Date: January 2021


This program, administered by ORAU through its contract with the U.S. Department of Energy to manage the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education, was established through an interagency agreement between DOE and CDC. The initial appointment can be up to one year, but may be renewed upon recommendation of CDC contingent on the availability of funds. The participant will receive a monthly stipend commensurate with educational level and experience.
